2. Methodology

The methodology used in this study is a combination of qualitative and quantitative methods. The qualitative methods include interviews, focus groups, and content analysis. The quantitative methods include surveys and statistical analysis.

2.1. Data Collection

2.1.1. Interviews

Semi-structured interviews were conducted with 10 participants. The interviews lasted approximately 45 minutes each and were audio-taped. The interview schedule was as follows:

The interviews were conducted in a private room at the participant's home. The participants were given a copy of the interview schedule and were asked to sign a consent form. The interviews were conducted by a research assistant who had experience in conducting interviews and was not involved in the data analysis.

2.2. Data Analysis

2.2.1. Content Analysis

2.2.1.1. Interview Data

The interview data was analysed using content analysis. This involves identifying themes or categories within the data. The themes were identified by the researcher and were used to code the data. The themes were: (1) the importance of the research, (2) the challenges of the research, (3) the benefits of the research, (4) the future of the research, and (5) the role of the researcher. The data was coded according to these themes and the frequency of each theme was counted. The results of the content analysis are presented in Table 1.

2.3. Statistical Analysis

The statistical analysis was conducted using SPSS. The data was analysed using descriptive statistics, inferential statistics, and regression analysis. The descriptive statistics included the mean, standard deviation, and frequency of each variable. The inferential statistics included t-tests, ANOVA, and chi-square tests. The regression analysis was used to identify the relationship between the variables. The results of the statistical analysis are presented in Table 2.

2.4. Ethical Approval

The study was given ethical approval by the local research ethics committee. All participants gave informed consent.
